Jury report – Women's U19 WFC 2006, Germany.

The tournament was played with 11 teams in the period 6th to 12th November 2006 in the east part of Germany in the cities of Naunhof (groups) and Leipzig (play-off). Only one arena at the time was used which positively affected the tournament and created a good “family” atmosphere.

The tournament had the same medalists like two years ago – Sweden, Finland, Switzerland, but the level of play has increased dramatically since Tampere 2004. Surprises were the German and Polish team with good performances. There were two groups - one consisted of six teams and the other of five teams which meant that some teams had to play 7 matches in seven days which seemed way too many for this category. The last matches were affected by the length of the tournament.

The general conclusion is that it was a good tournament. It was not perfect, but the LOC was enthusiastic and hard working. Only a few problems were actually visible for the spectators and most could be solved, so they hardly affected the teams. However, there were some problems that did affect the teams and thus influenced the tournament.

The strong points of the tournament:

- The atmosphere was perfect. During all matches there were quite many spectators, from around 50 to 600 in the Partelandhalle and 1300 in Leipzig.
- LOC was usually cooperative and working hard. Many things were improved during the week
- The setting in a small town (Naunhof – 10.000 inhabitants) was good for this tournament. It brought many spectators and good support from the local government
- Especially the opening and also the closing ceremony were really good, and during many matches there was some entertainment program for the spectators.
- Media interest from mostly local TV stations and newspapers

The main problem of the tournament:

- A lot of effort from the jury side was needed to improve the security. The LOC had decided to have a friendly tournament with ‘loose’ and ‘invisible’ security. This seemed ok and appropriate considering the type of tournament, but especially for the German matches and the final weekend special security arrangements had to be asked for. It was agreed that no spectators should be seated directly behind the team benches and no spectators should walk through the match secretariat. Unfortunately, this was not well looked after by the LOC. A lot of discussions and persuasions were needed to convince the LOC.
- There were some repeated problems with the national anthems. Incorrect anthems were played for team Russia and Slovakia. The corrected Slovakian anthem was too short, so this team had the wrong anthem twice. Beside that, different versions of the anthems were used. Because this problem tends to be repeated at almost every tournament the RACC discussed the solution of collecting similar versions of the anthems of all IFF members and store them on the IFF website for download by organizers.

- Almost all matches started too late, from 2 to 10 minutes. The schedule was good, with the usual timing, but the speaker was too slow and too passive. This was discussed several times, but led to only partial improvements.
- The dressing rooms in Naunhof were not perfect. A group of 2 team rooms and one referee room shared one shower area, so we had male referees who after the match entered a shower area filled with showering girls. Timing and privacy would be hard, so an alternative solution had to be found.
- There were some transportation problems. Team leaders were taken to the 2nd technical meeting too late, also some problems with transportation of teams and referees.
- There were major problems with the dressing rooms in Leipzig. Due to delayed renovation work, most of the dressing rooms were without water. The LOC had decided to use alternative dressing rooms, which were in the main spectator corridor, next to the bar and sandwich shop. The teams and referees would have to be forced to walk through a small alley, filled with eating and beer drinking spectators. This was not acceptable. After a discussion, during which some LOC protested that the arena and set-up was approved by IFF an O.K. solution for teams and referees, was found.
- The daily report was not used as good as possible. Problems that were discussed and solved were not noted that explicitly in the daily report. For local use, this is fine, but for the spreading of information and the archive this is not so good. RACC decided to discuss it more thoroughly and possibly prepare a guideline for jury members concerning this.
- There were teams not attending at the Technical meetings. Because it was caused by traveling reasons (delayed flights) and because of organizers mistake (late transportation for the 2nd tech meeting) and all teams apologized for that, no further action was proposed.

Dear Mr. Kratz,

In 2005, the International Floorball Federation (IFF) entrusted the organisation of the 4th U19 Men's World Floorball Championship to Switzerland on the basis of the application lodged by Swiss Unihockey.

The Swiss application was at that time based on the assumption that it would be running a World Championship with 16 participating nations from Wednesday to Sunday (as has been the custom to date). However, on 17 November 2006, you informed us by e-mail that the IFF is planning an event with 19 teams and a tournament lasting from Monday to Sunday.

Of recent days, Swiss Unihockey has thoroughly discussed the matter and, in particular, clarified the expenditure aspect. In so doing, we found that:

- the new, longer tournament would create substantial problems with regard to hall capacities (sufficient sports halls for an entire week)
- the new, longer tournament would create massive hall-cost problems (involving 3 to 4 days of additional hall rental)
- the new longer tournament would cause great problems with recruiting volunteers, since a whole work week will have to be invested. The local organisers have already informed us that they cannot come up with the necessary volunteers.
- If we assume the team transport costs we will incur additional expenditure of approx. Sfr. 50,000.00.

On revising the budget based on the actual cost of the 2003 Women's World Championship, the 2004 Men's World Championship and the 2006 World University Floorball Championship, we end up with a budget shortfall (including gate money and sponsorship income) of approximately Sfr. 130,000.00. Such a shortfall is unlikely to be approved by our members.

For Swiss Unihockey to be able to guarantee the holding of these World Championships, we would like to make the following procedural suggestion:

(a) That we hold the World Championships with 16 teams (if necessary a qualifying round would have to be played)

(b) That we play from Wednesday to Sunday

(c) That all the local transport (training, matches, etc.) be assumed by the participating teams

(d) That a lower organisation contribution to the IFF be set.

We would be very glad to discuss the above-mentioned points and to find a concerted solution for all parties concerned. We are really keen on hosting this World Championship in Switzerland and we really hope that we can continue to count on the support of the IFF.

We would greatly appreciate hearing from you on this by 15 December 2006 at the latest.

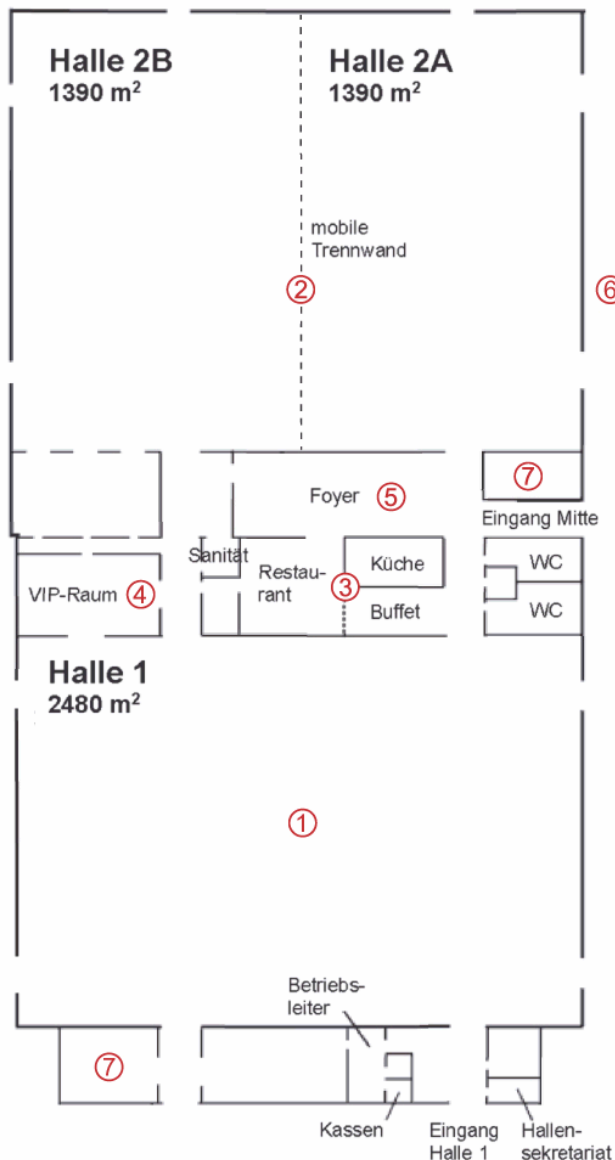

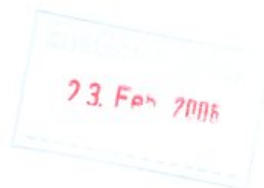

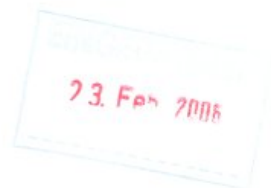

§1. Welcome

Mr. Liljelund greeted all heartily welcome and opened the meeting at 10.00 CET

§2. General update

2.1. IFF Activities working towards the IOC recognition

Mr. Liljelund informed that the IFF Central Board have put up a Road Map for reaching the IOC recognition by 2008. The requirement is to have 50 member federations and IFF is working very hard with all possible contacts to reach this goal. At the moment IFF has 38 member federations.

2.2. Development Seminars held in Holland and Poland

Mr. Liljelund informed on the IFF Floorball Development Programme Seminars been organised in Poland (October) and Netherlands (September), with between 30 – 40 participants. The next seminars will be held in Singapore (14.-17. December) with participants from Australia, China, Japan, India, Malaysia and Singapore. Also a seminar is planned for Canada (April 2007)

2.3. IFF Marketing and Floorball on TV

Mr. Liljelund gave a short review of the TV coverage situation from the upcoming European Cup Final round in Varberg, Sweden. The organiser has agreed with SVT for the production of four matches (both men's semi-finals and the Women's and Men's finals). SVT is showing all these matches.

IFF has also been able to secure these games on EuroSport 2.

§3.

ISPO Project 2007

Mr. Liljelund made a short summary of the presentation prepared in the ISPO matter. Based on the decision from the last meeting the IFF Office together with Mrs. Marja-Leena Koskinen has prepared a proposal for the ISPO project, which was sent out to all the DB members prior to the meeting, after IFF had received the input from Messe München/ISPO. The proposal is to build a Floorball village at the summer ISPO and invite as many manufacturers as possible to join it.

The DB members thanked Mrs. Koskinen, Ms. Bruun and Mr. Liljelund for a very well prepared presentation and a good proposal. Mr. Liljelund especially thanked Mrs. Koskinen for her time and effort. The DB felt that the year is right for the ISPO approach and they warmly welcomed the ISPO Floorball Village and felt that the approach was professional, and the set-up was perfect..

The DB discussed a number of practical issues related to the ISPO Floorball Village. The majority of the DB members felt that this is a joint-venture and that the visibility of the manufacturers in the development board has to be equally big. After a lengthy discussion the DB agreed that the size of the exhibitions can be between 12m² and 24 m², but not exceed that. After the meeting Mr. Liljelund checked upon request from Mr. Bergström/Exel, who had informed that he needed a bigger space for their stand, that it was ok for all the DB members that Exel may use the total space of Exel and Canadian (48m²) in a split where the smaller has as least 12 m². This was approved by all participants when asked separately.

It was agreed that the IFF Office will take care of the coordination of the Floorball Village and that IFF will now send out a letter to all other manufacturers not included in the DB and make the proposal for them. These companies will have until the 22nd of December to give there answer. All participants have to pay a security fee before IFF will reserve space for them.

The IFF Office will give feedback concerning the participants in the Floorball village, when it concerns the Floorball manufacturers by mid of January and then on a monthly basis give a status report to the manufacturers. It was agreed that the manufacturers will name a person in charge of this project to the IFF.

The Development Board will return to the practical issues in its next meeting. Mr. Liljelund will continue the discussions with DUB concerning their participation in the ISPO and the use of German Floorball players for the activities, under the guidance of IFF.

The **DB decided** to accept the proposal of the IFF and participate in the ISPO 2007 Floorball Village. All the seven brands agreed to participate with their own stand.

§4.

New projects for 2006

Mr. Liljelund gave the following report.
Of the projects decided upon in the last meeting the Start-up kit has been translated into French and it is published on the IFF web-site and the Development Seminars are rolling, with at least Singapore and Canada and Mid- and South-Europe to come during 2006 and 2007. The Development Board decided in February 2006 to postpone the German Project for one year. The German Floorball Federation (DUB) has approach the IFF and the Development Board with a new plan for the years 2007 – 2012 (see the appendix).

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INTERNATIONAL FLOORBALL FEDERATION (IFF)

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The IFF proposes that in connection with the ISPO and the other activities taken in Germany the DB would grant the project 15.000 CHF for year 2007.

The IFF also proposes that the remaining approx. 40.000 CHF will be used for the ISPO Project of the Development funds for 2004 – 2005, in accordance with the proposal where the manufacturers will be supported with a maximum of 25.000 CHF and IFF will have 15.000 CHF to organise the whole event.

If needed the DB can then decide about additional funds for the ISPO project in February 2007, when the 2006 result is known.

The **DB decided** to accept the proposal of the IFF and give the DUB a support of 15.000 CHF for 2007 based on the new development plan as a part of the total investment made in Germany with the ISPO 2007 summer fair. The DUB is requested to give a first report by end of June 2007 and a final report in end of December 2007. The reports are to be in English.

The **DB also decided** that the ISPO project will receive a total of 40.000 CHF according to the proposal.

Mr. Turtiainen proposed that the next IFF Development Board meeting will be held at the Winter ISPO in Munich on Tuesday the 6th of February. IFF will later organise the venue and agree upon the time table, in connection with Messe München.

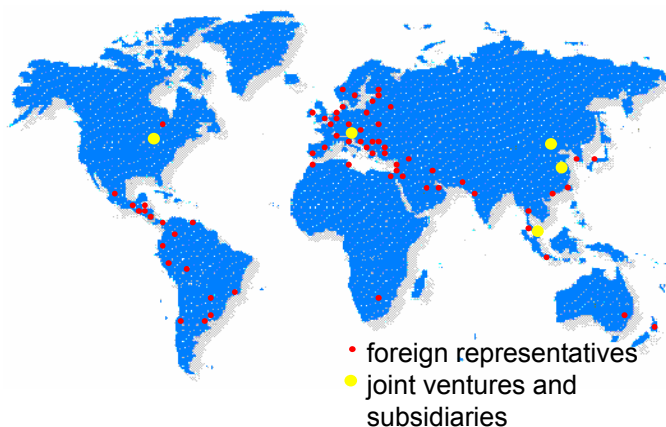

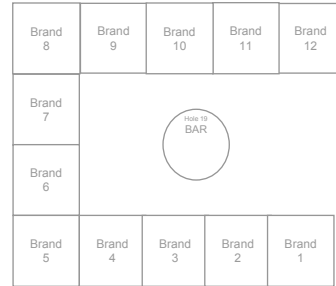

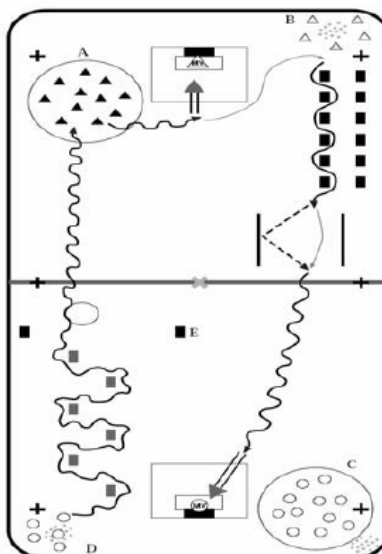

**Report on
present issues**

1. Opening

Mr. Liljelund opened the meeting at 10.00 at the IFF Office in Helsinki, Finland.

2. General issues

• **Last meeting 7.12.2005**

- SP has been thinking of some classification of the balls for the future, in order to be able whether there are technical differences. There are two ways in looking on the roundness of the ball. SP will come with a proposal until 1st of July about the classification system for the ball quality.
- The Family Certification is in use and only used by Exel.
- Market surveillance control reports to be submitted to SP by the 15th of January 2007.
- There has been no real solution found in the security issues discussed before.
- The changes of the goal cage to be able to be build from two different pieces.

• **Certification issue with SP/ITC**

- SP is very sorry, that the mistake has occurred and that the Arex stick which was correctly certificated, had not been updated on the SP list.
- SP has made some alterations in the information system of SP.
- SP to ask ITC to send a reference product of the products tested by ITC.
- SP to ask Arex for an official explanation about the mistake in the self-marking of their products.
- One idea is to demand that in the self-marking there should always been the name of the certificate owner on the stick/product. This is to be included in the material regulation.

• **Arex Master stick problems:**

- Mr. Henriksson informed that the Arex blade looks really much like the Canadian blade.
- In the Development Board meeting in 22.05.2003, it was discussed that SP would test whether if material is identical technically to other. SP could then propose to IFF that this new material should not be approved.
- According to the present Material Regulation, SP feels that they can't act in this case based on the issue. SP proposes that if Exel/Canadian wants to proceed in this mater, they should contact the patent and registration authority. IFF and SP can not according to the present rules to do anything else.
- Mr. Henriksson to write a letter to Exel/Bergström to explain the situation.
- SP will write a letter to Arex about the clear Level 3 breach in the IFF Material Regulation.

• **SP/ITC relationships**

- SP Certification feels that there is no need to have additional contact between SP and ITC, concerning the Arex case.

• **Certified Floorball Manufacturers:**

- There are now 38 certified companies, from 6 countries (Sweden 17, Finland 9, Czech Republic 6, Switzerland 4, Denmark 1 and Germany 1.)

Report on present issues cont.

- **Number of approved materials**
At the moment there are the following materials certified:
 - Balls: 20 different
 - Sticks: 596 different
 - Blades: 99 different
 - Goal cages: 9 different
 - Rinks: 18 different
 - Face masks: 13 different
- **SP Newsletter Jan/2007**
 - SP name change, new IFF sticker, sticker to the face masks, information about the new price of the face mask stickers.
 - SP to launch a new SP internet site starting from the 1st of March. SP to send a new link to the IFF, at least one day before the actual change.
 - SP is looking to combine some information on the site.

3. *Sold materials*

 - The total number of sold materials:
 - Balls 1.512.391 pcs 268 676 kr

 - SP will send the invoices to IFF during December.
- **Self-marking:**

 - Self-marking reports all under control

4. *Surveillance Market Control*

 - o IFF Self-marking sticker layout (Level 1) – possible sanction warning.
 - o Not registered model (Level 2) – possible sanction fine 2000 CHF
 - o Wrong placement of Self-marking sticker – no action
 - o Not IFF Sticker – no action
 - o Bad mounted screws (Level 1) – possible sanction warning, if continued, then a small fine.
 - o Stick dimension (Level 1) – no action
 - o Annual rate missing – no action
 - SP will give a proposal for the sanctions to IFF by the end of January 2007.
 - Internal journals are a big problem, it might be an idea to remove the need for in-house journals, except when there are problems the companies needs to report them
 - Reminder to be sent to SB-Yhtiöt and Takos about the sanction for not giving the records for 2005.
 - SP to take action concerning the 3 companies that have not responded with any actions concerning the failed surveillance test in 2005.

5. *Material Regulation*

- More exact definition of the self-marking printing, where you are allowed to print on the design of the stick.
- To include the source of the product on to the stick.
- To include shorter Floorball sticks into the regulation. SP to inform in the Newsletter in January.

Report on present issues cont.

6. *Agreement SP and IFF*

- In the existing agreement between SP and IFF there are at the moment no real need to change anything.
- It was proposed from the IFF that we for the next three years would pay a yearly sum of 20.000 CHF, including the internet- and information services for a three year period. SP to give an answer to this in the beginning in the year.

7. *Test criteria's and CE-marking for Protective Eye-ware for Floorball*

- IFF has bought the system from the Swedish Federation
- IFF takes control of the method starting from January 1st 2007
- The products approved by SP shall/can be marked with the text IFF Recommended and the logo.
- SP to handle the practical issues related to approved eye-ware. SP to send the IFF decision to the manufacturer.
- SP to translate the method and the related information into English. SP will give an estimation of the costs related to the translation in the beginning of January.
- SP to include this on the IFF/SP web-page
- First products will be certificated under the new IFF system no later than 1st of January.

Upcoming meetings and issues

- The next meeting will be held in May 2008.

Issues that need to be discussed or decided upon or taken action upon

- IFF to make a decision about the potential sanctions for the products which have not passed the surveillance tests during 2006, by the end of January.

Report on present issues

1. *Opening*

The meeting was organised in order to discuss the open issues concerning the co-operation between IFF and Exel Sports.

2. *ISPO 2007*

We discussed the Development board meeting and concluded that the same PPT presentation and a separate invitation will be sent out to all manufacturers on the SP list next week, in order to invite them to the Fair.

As Mr. Bergström had during the meeting raised the question concerning the maximum size of the stands, the size of the Stands has to be discussed by IFF and DVB members. Mrs. Koskinen was disappointed that the Development Board had limited the size to only 24 m2 and demanded a bigger space, which she claimed that Exel needs. The suggestion was to either enlarge to space span to 12-36m2 or use the 24+24m2 is ok if the brands can design the setup inside this area as they like, keeping in mind the restriction of the minimum size of 12 m2. Mr. Liljelund was to present this proposal to all parties.

EXEL sports contact person for the ISPO project is Marja-Leena Koskinen.

There will be held a turn-over meeting during the European Cup in Varberg 3-7th of January, with Koskinen Exel Sports, Martin Kössler/ISPO and IFF.

The next Development Board meeting will be held on 6th of February, Tuesday at ISPO with Munic Messe. Mrs. Koskinen to participate and suggest also Martin Kössler/Ispo.

3. *Exel Sports Material deliveries:*

According to our agreement Exel has to supply IFF with a number of Floorball materials. This issue was discussed thoroughly.

Exel Sports has to deliver the following material:

2 x Rinks: The rinks would be needed at the European Cup in Varberg. Mr. Bergström to check with Swerink if there are two rinks available. Delivery to Varberg is possible, but delivery time will have to be checked on Monday 27 of November.

4 x Goals (official size) : Official Goals will be sent to IFF, with Goal Stickers. Mrs. Koskinen will check the size of the Goal stickers.

Balls: Exel sports will send 2800 Vanilla balls to IFF. The difference to the yearly 4000 balls is already shipped to U19 & Varberg.

500 sticks: Exel Sports will deliver Miracle Sets+ some other 50pcs better sticks in flex 2.3-2.7 flex to be sent to IFF.

10 Goalie sets: Exel Sports will send Sr, M/3, L/3, XL/4, No Changes Pant, Jersey, Helmet to be sent to IFF

The orders for this will be done by Mr. Bergström next week.

4. *Follow-up from Germany U19 WFC*

Everything worked well during the U19 WFC in Germany. The ads where in place and the exhibition of EXEL & Canadien worked well with stands and importers.

It was noted that the Face off stickers, that glue are loosing otherwise good.

5. *Routines for ordering materials and Ads for each year.*

Exel Sports wished that IFF would make one order every year when it comes to the commercial material we are using in the IFF Events.

It was decided that IFF will order all the sticker materials for the Events during 2007 already in January.

IFF – MC Report 21st of December 2006

Report on present issues

1. *General issues*

- The IFF MC now consists of three members when Doctor Tiina Nylander, who is the doctor of the Finnish Men's National Volleyball team, became the third member of the IFF MC in October 2006. The other two members are Dr. Walter O. Frey from Switzerland, who is also involved in the Swiss Olympic and Dr. Pernille Opstrup from Denmark.
- In the beginning we had some difficulty to get in touch with the members and there have also been some open questions regarding the cooperation of the MC Members. Currently the cooperation has been working much better.
- After the establishment of the IFF MC the IFF has received 19 ATUE applications and one TUE application. When the IFF office receives an application the date of the reception is saved and also the date when the application is sent forward to two of the MC Committee members, this date and to whom the application is sent is also saved. The ATUE's are valid from the date the application is received by the IFF and a notification of receipt is sent to the player and to WADA (+ member association). The TUE is valid from the date the MC has made their decision and the IFF TUE decision is sent to the athlete and to WADA (+ member association)

Upcoming meetings and issues

- The IFF Office will arrange a meeting with the members of the Medical Committee in order to discuss the work and practices, as it has been proposed by the MC members. As it looks now the MC meeting will be held in Zürich on the 8th of February 2007.

Issues that need to be discussed or decided upon or taken action upon

- The IFF now has three MC Members, but we would still need to find new members to the IFF Medical Committee in order decrease the workload of the current members and for us to function properly.
- Establish a chair of the IFF MC
- We would also need to draw common lines for the future concerning the length of the Therapeutic Use Exemptions and also who will have the final decision if two MC Member's opinions differ.
- Some NADO's have also asked if we can accept applications if the form is in English and based on the same WADA form with the player's and doctor's details in English, which needs to be discussed

Euro Floorball Cup Qualifications system:

The EFC will be played for both men and women with two regional qualification tournaments, one qualification tournament for 2nd teams from the top 4 countries and a final round with 8 teams, as was decided in January 2006.

This enclosure contains proposals for the qualification tournaments, starting summer/autumn 2007.

Men and women together

The qualification tournaments for men and women will be organized together, in the same country/city, but not necessarily in the same sports hall.

Qualification for second teams from top 4 ranked countries.

The qualification tournament will have 6-8 participating teams (3-4 men, 3-4 women).

If the reigning champion and new national champion are not the same team, this country already has two places and thus can not participate in the qualification tournament for the second ranked teams.

- The qualification tournament has to be organized by one of the participating countries. The organizer should be chosen latest in April.

Qualification tournaments for national champions

Two regional tournaments will be organized. The winner of each tournament will qualify for the final round (both men and women).

- Europe will be divided upfront in 2 roughly equal parts based on geography and strength, so that national champions know upfront where they would go and decide upon that information. Men and women from a country will always be in the same tournament.
- IFF will ask countries from both regions to bid for organization. If no country from a region wants to organize, this regions qualification place will automatically go to the other region (thus giving this region 2 places).
- The organizers for the regional qualification have to be known latest 30 April, so national champions can decide based on this information if they want to participate.
- Because the division will be made upfront, it is possible that the 2 regional tournaments will be of different size and strength. Therefore, Every two years the regions will be evaluated, based on strength and number of participants
- Alternatives, such as to divide men and women or seeding the champions based on strength only, were evaluated by the RACC, but are not suitable/feasible: division on strength will be too expensive for participants, splitting men and women will lead to too many tournaments/organizers

Proposal of WFC 'new style' system

Basics:

The WFC 'new style' will consist of continental qualification tournaments and a final round with 16 teams. Of these 16 teams, 15 have qualified through continental tournaments and 1 is the organizing country.

The WFC 'new style' will be played for men and women only, not for U19.

The first WFC 'new style' for men could be played in 2010, based on the CB decision and willing of the appointed organizer. The first WFC 'new style' for women should start year after men.

WFC Final round

The WFC final round will be played with 4 groups of 4 teams. During the group phase, the teams play each other once (single round). The highest 2 ranked teams play quarter finals, followed by semi-finals and finals. A full tournament will be played with placement matches for all teams. The 3rd and 4th ranked teams play placement matches against the other 3rd or 4th ranked teams.

The tournament like this can be played in 2 arena's, with 4 matches in each arena every day and a total of 7 days, allowing the semi finalists a day rest between quarter finals and semi finals.

The seeding in the 4 groups will be based on a ranking. This ranking is based on the results during the last 2 WFC's and the last 2 qualifications. Based on this ranking the teams will be divided in 4 baskets (1-4, 5-8, 9-12, 13-16). For each group, one team will be selected from each basket.

A ballot will decide the order in the groups. The order of the matches is fixed in the Competition regulations.

Quota

The quota for the WFC final round will be based on the number of registered teams. After the registration deadline, the number of registered teams will be divided by 15, thus giving the quota factor. The number of registered teams per continent will then be divided by the quota factor, thus giving the number of places in the final round for this continent, based on whole numbers. If after this a place remains, it will go to the continent with most registered teams. If still a place remains, this will go to the continent which comes closest to reaching the next quota place limit.

Remarks:

- If there is only one country registered for a continent, this country could be added to the continent with the least registered teams or to the continent decided according to costs.
- The organizer is considered 'extra' and thus gives the organizers continent an extra place in the final round.
- Quota example: Europe 25, Asia 6, America 3 participants: Europe 11, Asia 2, America 1 places, one for the organizer and one extra for Europe = total 16.

WFC Qualifications

The Qualification is played with continental tournaments. The winner of the tournament and preferably also the second ranked team qualify for the final round.

Considering the current development of Floorball, we can expect to have qualification tournaments in Europe, America and Asia/Oceania. In both Europe and Asia there will probably be multiple qualification tournaments.

Qualification timeline

Qualifications should be played between April and October in the year before the final round. (Final round in May)

Best term for qualifications should be discussed from different points of views, but by choosing October, the Qualification round will be closer to the upcoming WFC than the previous WFC, thus making it easier for the teams to train and prepare. Plus it will still give the WFC organizer enough time to prepare for the final round. However, the ballot for the final round has to be done immediately after the Qualification round.

All European Qualification tournaments have to be played at the same time because of the possibility that best 3rd team qualifies. The other continents don't have to play their qualification in the same weekend, but they have to be played at the same time or before the European tournaments.

Qualification ballot and ranking

Ballot for the Qualification should be based on ranking. The previous 2 WFC's plus the last qualification will be used for the ranking.

The ballot for the Qualifications can be done in May, during the WFC. For the qualification ballot a similar system will be used as for the final round ballot.

If not all groups will have the same size, a ballot will decide what groups will have an extra participant.

Qualification tournaments and organizers

The number of European qualification tournaments will be the number of continental places, divided by two. Countries can bid for a qualification tournament. Preferably the lower ranked teams will get the tournament. If no team wants to organize the qualification tournament, rule that the highest ranked team will have to organize the qualification tournament can be considered.

If Europe will have an uneven number of continental places, the best ranked third team will also qualify for the final round.

The selection of the qualification organizers can be done prior to the ballot. All organizers will simply be placed in different groups.

Rules and Competition Committee

§ 1 GENERAL

1. Rules and Competition Committee (hereafter „RACC“) is a special committee established by the Central Board of the International Floorball Federation.

§ 2 Mission of RACC

1. The mission of RACC is to provide rules and regulation to ensure fair and attractive IFF events, to help organizers in staging good IFF events and to ensure that all rules, regulations and IFF events are in line with the international development of floorball.

§ 3 Tasks of RACC

3.1 - Competitions:

A) System of competitions:

Concerning the system of competitions RACC shall:

- keep a general list of the IFF events
- propose changes of the IFF events
- propose the time-line (enclosure) of the IFF events
- propose the system of each IFF event
 - Structure of the event
 - Number of teams
 - Playing system
 - Promotions and relegations
 - Qualifications
- keep record of the Rankings

B) Tournaments (IFF events)

Concerning each IFF tournament RACC shall:

- Comment the proposal of potential organizers
- Fix, set and approve registered teams
- Organize the ballot (order within the groups)
- Approve playing schedules
- Approve changes of playing schedules
- Approve changes in the team lists
- Appoint the jury
- Chair the technical meeting
- Evaluate the event from the jury point of view

C) Other international matches

Concerning international matches RACC shall:

- keep lists of international matches
- evaluate the international calendar

3.2 - Rules and regulations:

A) Rules of the game:

Concerning rules of the game RACC shall:

- propose time-lines for the changing of the IFF Rules of the Game
- gather potential changes
- propose testing of potential changes
- evaluate results of tests
- propose rule changes
- interpret rules in co-operation with the IFF Referee Committee

B) Regulations:

Concerning regulations RACC shall propose changes in:

- Competition Regulations for National Teams
- Competition Regulations for Club Teams
- Friendly International Matches regulations
- Organizers Regulations
- International Transfers Regulations
- Guidelines for organizers

3.3. – International Transfers:

Concerning international transfers RACC shall:

- administrate transfers
- decide in complicated transfer matters

3.4 - Committee:

Concerning committee work RACC shall:

- propose the budget of the RACC
- keep the approved budget
- organize committee meetings within the frame of the budget
- decide the system of work within RACC
- educate and support (new) international jury members
- report to the IFF Central Board

WFC boys U19 2007

A total of 19 teams have registered. This is more than would fit within the system of 8 teams in A division and 8 in B division which was used for last two Men's U19 WFCs.

All 16 teams which played in 2005 in Latvia were told that they were qualified for A and B division in 2007 and all of them registered. This leaves no spot for potential qualification. Tournament with 16 teams would practically mean that no new teams would have a chance to participate and category would be closed.

In the invitation for U19 2007 it was stated that IFF invites each member to take part and there was also information that (except "A" division teams) further registered teams will form a B-division.

There has to be discussion with organizer how to secure the possibility to participate for new teams.

In case this discussion will be successful RACC proposes to increase both the A division and B division to 10 teams. (in 2007 the B division would consist of only 9 teams)

Promotion/relegation: The 10th ranked team at WFC 2007 will relegate to B division; the winner of the B division will be promoted to A division during WFC 2009.

To increase the A division from 8 to 10 teams, we suggest to promote the 2nd and 3rd ranked team from WFC U19 2005. This would not require any additional qualification matches.

An alternative solution could be to promote the 2nd ranked team and play a qualification match between the 3rd ranked team and the team that was relegated from A division. However, this would require extra qualification matches that have to be played as soon as possible, preferably in April 2007.

RACC will hand in a proposal how to handle the further growth of the WFC U19 prior to the CB meeting in September 2007, so all teams which will participate in WFC will know in advance how U19 2009 will be organized.

RACC summary – January 2007

1. Report from WFC U19 Women Germany 2006 (enclosure RACC_1)

The last IFF tournament - WFC U19 Women was played with 11 teams in the period from 6th to 12th November 2006 in the east part of Germany in the cities of Naunhof (groups) and Leipzig (play-off). The tournament had the same medalists as two years ago – Sweden, Finland, Switzerland, but the level of play has increased dramatically since Tampere 2004. Details in the enclosure 1

2. EFC qualifications – new system (enclosure RACC_2)

During 2007 the new system for the EFC qualifications starts. It was already decided that there will be two regional qualifications for national champions and one qualification for 2nd best teams from the top 4 countries.

The proposal is to have two regional tournaments, always men and women together and have the regions divided into 2 roughly equal parts based on geography and strength. By doing this the champions from the countries know upfront where they would go and decide upon that information. Men and women from one country will always be in the same tournament.

Details in the enclosure 2

3. WFC – new system with 16 teams (enclosure RACC_3)

With the new WFC system there is a need for preparing how the whole system will work. It was already decided that new system will consist of continental qualification tournaments and a final round with 16 teams. Of these 16 teams, 15 have qualified through continental tournaments and 1 is the organizing country.

The WFC will be played with the new system for men and women only, not for U19 due to costs.

The first WFC 'new style' for men could be played in 2010, based on the CB decision and willingness of the appointed organizer. The first WFC 'new style' for women should start the year after the men.

The WFC final round is preferable played with 4 groups of 4 teams. During the group phase, the teams play each other once (single round). The highest 2 ranked teams play quarter finals, followed by semi-finals and finals. Details of the new system - enclosure 3.

4. RACC tasks (enclosure RACC_4)

As the RC has prepared a committee tasks document, RACC reports about RACC tasks. Enclosure 4.

5. U19 Men 2007 (enclosure RACC_5)

19 teams have registered for the Men's U19 WFC 2007. RACC has prepared a proposal on how to play the tournament. Enclosure 5.

6. Upcoming issues

There are a lot of issues that need to be solved in the near future. RACC is preparing proposals how to handle them.

a) Increasing need for organizers

Today we have 4 events that need to have an organizer every year. 2007 and 2008 we probably will have 2 more due to the new system of the EFC qualifications (enclosure RACC_4).

If the WFC Men and Women is going to change to play offs with 16 teams we will increase the 6 organized events to 13 (5 qualifications in Europe, 1 in Asia and 1 in America). This is a heavily increased number of organizers which is needed every year.

In the near future a change in the U19 system has to come (19 registered teams already in 2007). This will bring more organizers needed. This will be a totally new situation and good preparations are vital.

b) Timeline

RACC is preparing a proposal concerning a more detailed timeline (what should be done when before a tournament). Especially with more tournaments it will be necessary to keep track on preparations and there will also be different timelines for different tournaments.

c) WFC women in 2009

The next WFC 2009 will have to have some kind of qualification. The main aspects which RACC has to work out proposals for are:

- should we have special continental places or just divide the teams on a geographical basis?
- how many places should be open for qualification?

The alternative is to install a C-division but if assuming that the Women's WFC 2011 will be played with qualifications and a play-off with 16 teams it doesn't seem to be a good alternative.

d) Future of WFC U19

RACC will try to prepare a system that already when the countries register there is a plan for how the tournament is going to be played and if qualification is needed. This is depending on the number of teams that will participate.

For Men's U19 2009 and Women's U19 2010 there will probably be enough teams to have one A division and to split B division into two. The main aspects that RACC has to work out proposals for are;

- a system that will attract most countries to participate
- relegation and promotion between A and B and B
- the two B divisions being played at the same time
- same organizer or regional organizers for the B-division

e) Levels of events

When the number of organizers is increasing we probably will have to change the demands of the different tournaments. This means that we have to build organizers regulations (or develop the organizers guidelines) to meet the different demands regarding the tournaments level.

Example of possible levels:

1. Men and Women WFC
2. EFC finals and U19 WFC A division
3. Men and Women WFC Qualifications, U19 B division
4. EFC Qualifications

RACC will cooperate with other IFF bodies on proposal to set levels of demands

f) Rules and interpretations

RACC is not planning any changes regarding the Rules group and timeline to the next rule book 2010, meaning that the same system as the last four years would be used.

Proposal: M Wolmhed head of RG + member from FIN, SUI, SWE in the group and S Kratz from the office. F Suman and T Gilardi acts as a steering committee. The actual work with the next edition of the game rules shall start in January 2008.

Regarding interpretations RACC proposes that the rules group is collecting and working with all questions. All answers are public on the IFF website and a summary of all answers is sent to all federations. A more detailed guideline concerning rules interpretations will be prepared (e.g. only federations can send official answers etc...)

We have seen that countries handle the same issues in different ways and that IFF needs to give guidelines to have the same handling in all countries.

g) Jury instructions/guidelines

With increased number of organizers there will be a need of more people at the different competitions and often they will have to work as Jury alone or with someone in the RC. RACC think instructions/guidelines are necessary for helping the IFF persons in place and also for giving other technical information like traveling, how to dress, etc.
